Nursing Excellence Awards 2021

Each year, Cooper University Health Care celebrates our nursing community and collaborative teams with the Nursing Excellence Awards. This packet provides the Nomination Form and information about the various awards.

- As of 2020, we now have two awards for Excellence in Oncology Nursing. The Rose Smith & Sue Zamitis Award is for Excellence in Inpatient Oncology Nursing and is open to nurses and Advanced Practice Nurses who work in the inpatient setting. The Franklin Morse Archer Jr. & Mary Joy Reeve Archer Memorial Award for Excellence in Outpatient Oncology Nursing is open to nurses and Advanced Practice Nurses who work in Ambulatory locations.
- The Outstanding Team Award will be presented to a team that demonstrates excellence in patient care services and collaboration with all members of the health care team. This award is open to ALL Cooper employees.
- Professional Nurses and Advanced Practice Nurses, in the ambulatory care or inpatient setting at any Cooper University Health Care location, are eligible to be nominated for Nursing Excellence Awards.
- Allied Health Professionals (non-nurses) are eligible to be nominated for the Allied Health Professional Excellence Award.
- Physicians are eligible to be nominated for the Nursing-Physician Partnership Award.
- Any non-nurse member of the patient care team is eligible to be nominated for the Barbara and Jack Tarditi Award for Excellence in Service.
- The Carol G.Tracey Compassion Award is open to ALL Cooper employees.
- All nominees must be Cooper employees in good standing.
- Awards are to be used for education, training or research.

Eligibility: Professional nurses or Advanced Practice Nurses who have worked in their clinical specialty at Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12months.

Description/Criteria: These awards are presented to nurses who demonstrate excellence in their clinical specialty. Excellence in patient care delivery is evidenced by the following:

- Demonstrates innovative ways to advance the practice of nursing
- ✓ Commitment to patient quality care as evidenced by contributing to favorable clinical outcomes
- Acknowledged by peers as an excellent care provider
- Recognized for his/her contribution to patient and family satisfaction
- ✓ Demonstrates excellence in teamwork and collaboration with members of the healthcare team
- √ Patient-centered approach to decision-making, problem-solving, and care delivery
- √ Fosters an environment of learning
- √ Promotes a family-centered care environment
- Pursues continuing education through professional growth and development (professional certification; enrolled in an academic program, etc.)
- Actively involved in unit-specific or hospital based committees
- Demonstrates professionalism in all interactions

Other Nursing Excellence Awards

Moorestown Auxiliary Award for Excellence in Advanced Practice Nursing

Eligibility: Advanced practice providers who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 2 years.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to an Advanced Practice Provider (CRNA, NP or PA) who demonstrates excellence in his/her role. This is evidenced by the following:

- √ Shows a high level of commitment to Cooper University Health Care
- Assists in shaping the delivery of healthcare within organization and practice area
- √ Demonstrates innovation in the field of advanced clincial practice roles
- Exhibits excellence in patient care by impacting measurable outcomes
- √ Recognized by colleagues as a valued, collaborative member of the healthcare team while demonstrating autonomy in daily practice
- Actively mentors and educates peers
- √ Consistently serves as a patient care advocate

The Philip and Carole Norcross Award for Nurse Leadership

Eligibility: Professional nurses and Advanced Practice Nurses in leadership roles who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a nurse leader who demonstrates the ability to create an environment in which clinical excellence is fostered and independent problem solving and solution seeking are valued. This is evidenced by the following:

- Achieves favorable organizational outcomes
- √ Acknowledged by peers as leader
- √ Fosters the development of leadership and independence among colleagues
- ✓ Demonstrates and role models professionalism in all interactions
- Facilitates or creates an environment that fosters autonomy, collaboration and creativity
- Motivates and inspires others to work to their fullest potential
- √ Maintains a positive outlook
- ✓ Demonstrates an enthusiastic and genuine belief in the capacity of others; strengthens individuals' wills, and supplies them the means to achieve and express optimism for the future.
- ✓ Serves as a change agent and supports others in the change process
- ✓ Serves as an advocate for employees, patients, and the organization
- ✓ Pursues continuing education through professional growth and development (professional certification; enrolled in an academic program, etc.)

The Barbara and Jack Tarditi Award for Excellence in Nursing Mentorship

Eligibility: Professional nurses and Advanced Practice Nurses who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a nurse who serves as an exceptional mentor to colleagues and other members of the healthcare team. This is evidenced by the following:

- Fosters the integration of inexperienced and new staff into the team
- / Demonstrates excellent coaching and guidance skills
- √ Motivates team members to achieve higher standards and level of practice
- √ Fosters an environment of learning
- ✓ Identifies potential problems and takes the initiative to intervene
- ✓ Supports new team members in problem-solving issues
- ✓ Demonstrates excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- √ Identifies learning/developmental needs of staff and acts as a resource in supporting new staff
- Serves as an advisor to members of the healthcare team.

The Barbara and Jack Tarditi Award for Excellence in Nursing Research

Eligibility: Professional nurses and Advanced Practice Nurses or nursing teams who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a nurse or nursing team in recognition of their contribution to the advancement of nursing by either participating in nursing research, a quality improvement project or evidence-based practice. This is evidenced by the following:

- Active and ongoing engagement in either a nursing IRB approved research study, quality improvement project, or evidence-based practice that has resulted in change to nursing practice with the potential for wider change within nursing education, nursing practice, or nursing research
- Research, quality improvement, or evidence-based practice project disseminated to a broader nursing audience (i.e. podium, poster presentation, manuscript submission or publication, Cooper or non-Cooper committee, etc.)

The Shaina Horton Memorial Award for Excellence in Service

Eligibility: Professional nurses and Advanced Practice Nurses who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a professional nurse who demonstrates excellence in patient-centered care. This is evidenced by the following:

- ✓ Exhibits consideration of the patient's cultural traditions, personal preferences, and values during patient interactions and care delivery
- ✓ Exhibits consideration of the patient's family situations, social circumstances, and life styles during patient interactions and care delivery
- ✓ Focuses on the patient's physical, emotional, and social needs when delivering care
- ✓ Demonstrates a positive attitude in all patient and family interactions
- ✓ Serves as a role model to members of the healthcare team
- √ Acknowledged as a patient advocate by members of the healthcare team
- Establishes positive relationships with patients and families
- ✓ Demonstrates excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- √ Promotes a patient-centered care environment
- Recognized for his/her contribution to patient and family satisfaction

Collaborative Team Awards

The Barbara and Jack Tarditi Award for Excellence in Service (Non-Nursing)

Eligibility: Non-nurse members of the patient care team who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a non-nurse member of the healthcare team who demonstrates excellence in patient care service. This is evidenced by the following:

- Acknowledged by peers as a valued teammember
- Recognized for his/her contribution to patient and family satisfaction
- ✓ Demonstrates excellence in teamwork and collaboration with members of the healthcare team
- √ Contributes to increasing the level of health and well-being for patients, families, and the community
- √ Promotes a patient and family-centered care environment
- Establishes positive relationships with patients and families
- Acknowledged as a patient advocate
- Demonstrates excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- ✓ Contributes to systems and processes that support excellence in patient care

The Women's Board of Cooper University Health Care Allied Health Professional Excellence Award (Non-Nursing)

Eligibility: Allied health professionals (non-nurses) who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months. Allied health professionals inlude social wokers; mental health professionals; physical; occupational; speech and language and respiratory therapists; radiology; surgical; diagnostic and other technicians; dieticians and clinical pharmacists.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to an allied health professional member of the healthcare team who demonstrates a collaborative, productive working relationship with their nursing colleagues. This is evidenced by the following:

- Acknowledged by peers as a partner and valuable team member
- ✓ Demonstrates excellence in teamwork and collaboration with members of the healthcare team
- ✓ Able to resolve areas of potential conflict with either team members, patients or their families
- ✓ Exhibits a willingness to help even if the help required falls outside the employees specific job requirements
- ✓ Demonstrates professionalism, excellent communication and interpersonal skills

Nursing Alumni Excellence Award for Nursing-Physician Partnership

Eligibility: Physicians who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a physician who demonstrates a collaborative, productive working relationship with nursing colleagues. This is evidenced by the following:

- Acknowledged by peers as a partner and valuable team member
- ✓ Demonstrates excellence in teamwork and collaboration with members of the healthcare team
- √ Demonstrates a patient-centered approach to decision-making, problem-solving, and care delivery
- ✓ Able to resolve areas of potential conflict with either team members, patients or their families
- ✓ Serves as a mentor to members of the healthcare team
- ✓ Demonstrates professionalism, excellent communication and interpersonal skills

Compassion Award OPEN TO ALL COOPER EMPLOYEES

Carol G.Tracey Compassion Award

Eligibility: Employees who have been employed by Cooper University Health Care for a minimum of 12 months.

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a Cooper employee who demonstrates determination and dedication during times of personal hardship and suffering. This is evidenced by:

- Exhibiting courage and strength during a personal time of adversity
- Maintaining a positive outlook and attitude
- √ Serving as a role model to others
- ✓ Dedicated to the Cooper mission: to serve, to heal, to educate
- ✓ Inspires others to overcome adversity through inspiration and hope

Outstanding Team Award OPEN TO ALL COOPER EMPLOYEES

Eligibility: Any team employed by Cooper University Health Care

Description/Criteria: This award is presented to a team that demonstrates excellence in patient care services and collaboration with all members of the healthcare team. This is evidenced by the following:

- Makes significant contributions to the improvement of care for patients
- Demonstrates excellence and teamwork with all members of the healthcare team
- ✓ Contributes innovative, progressive, and sustainable ideas that can be replicated or adapted in other departments
- Has shown dedicated commitment to delivery of services for patients
- √ Always exhibits a willingness to help all members of the healthcare team
- √ Maintains a positive outlook
